

Apple Investigation

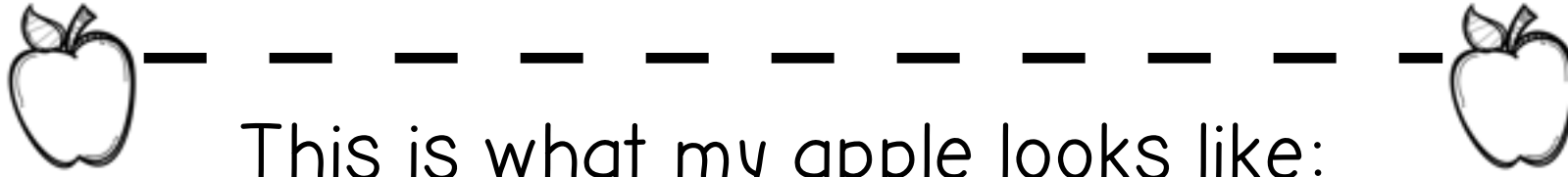
For our apple investigations, I give each of my students half of an apple. I try to mix it up with some students having red, some with yellow, and some with green. You can have them share with their tables or with partners, too.

The students draw what they see on the outside of their apple, and what it looks like on the inside.

Then, students can count how many seeds their apple.

After they have counted the seeds, I let my students taste the apple and write three adjectives to describe it.

During this time, I also pass out pieces of yellow, green, and red apples for students to taste and compare.
